Annual Report 2017-18

Centre for Development and Research (CDR) is working for the well being of the tribal People in East Godavari district since 2008. Overall objective that is to "*Improve the quality of life of the poorest and most disadvantaged members of tribal society on a sustainable basis through community empowerment*" in quite interior and far flung villages in Maredumilli and Y.Ramavaram Mandals. Konda Reddis, a vulnerable tribe, is the predominant section of the tribal population in this Mandals. CDR made a choice to work with the most needy of the tribals in the most remote of the district.

Geographical Conditions of the operational area:


East Godavari district can be broadly classified into three natural divisions, namely, the delta, upland and agency or hill tracts. The general elevation of the district varies from a few meters near the sea to about 300 meters in the hills of the agency. The Eastern Ghats rise by gradations from the level of the coast and spread throughout the agency 11 mandals.

Maredumilli Mandal:

It is composed of 78 villages. It is an interior Tribal habitation with 903.44 Sq. Kms. areas bordering with Khammam District endowed with evergreen Tropical Forest and Wildlife. There are many Tribal groups living and most of them were Primitive Tribes (PTGs). Podu Cultivation, Hunting, Animal Grazing and Forest Produce Collection are the way of living. In some places very good timber, tea, rubber and coffee plantations are existing. Infrastructure like roads, buildings, electricity, health, civic amenities and education is very less in comparison.

Y.Ramavaram Mandal:

Total population of Y. Ramavaram Mandal is 27,950 living in 6,549 Houses, Males are 13,587 and Females are 14,363. Y. Ramavaram consist of 148 Villages and 17 Panchayats . Kunkumamidi is the smallest Village and Donkarai is the biggest Village . It is in the 27 m elevation (altitude). Y. Ramavaram Mandal is bounded by by Maredumilli Mandal towards west , Addateegala Mandal towards South, Rampachodavaram Mandal towards South, Koyyuru Mandal towards East.



Maa Vooru Maa Badi Programme

CDR is the architect in designing these community governed schools. It is assisting the community of tribal mothers to run 58 pre-primary schools in as many villages for 3 to 5 year tiny tots. All these activity based schools are located in Maredumilli, Y.Ramavaram and Rampachodavaram Mandals in East Godavari District.

Objectives:

- Provide best quality activity based joyful education to children between 3 to 5 years.
- Build self confidence, enthusiasm and cheer among the little children and prepare them to go the Primary school
- Schools only in tribal areas and Scheduled Caste habitations
- Every school to be entirely owned and governed by the mothers
- Establish proof of concept for delivering high quality education in community governed pre primary schools for applying the same concept to Govt. Primary schools.

Unique Features of "Maa Vooru Maa Badi"

1. Pancha Teermanalu.

Every school is established by the community of mothers. They have to fulfill five essential pre requisites and pass the *Pancha Teermanalu*. They are

- i. Resolve to set up a school
- ii. Survey the children in prescribed age group identified for enrollment.
- iii. Identify persons suitable for teaching their children
- iv. Identify suitable place for the school.
- v. Nominate a five members School Committee of mothers.

2. Nava Sutralu - Nine Responsibilities

- i. Ensure full attendance in the school
- ii. Two mothers to participate in school activities everyday by rotation at least for one hour
- iii. Attend weekly display of articles made by children during daily session of creative activities
- iv. Invite grand parents every week for sharing their stories

- v. Conduct Badi Panduga on last Saturday of every month
- vi. Save Rs. 100 every month for every child in school
- vii. Teams of MMS members to visit every school once every month
- viii. Celebrate Birthday of the child by planting and protecting two saplings in their field
 - ix. Save Rs. 10 for each pupil every month for meeting the needs of the school

3. Monthly visit of schools by members of Mandala Mahila Samakhya.

• Village Organisation (VO) and the Badi Committee examine the learning outcomes achieved by the children every month.

4.Badi Panduga: Monthly Public Report on Learning Outcomes

- Badi Panduga Festival of Learning is held in the last Saturday of every month in every school.
- All mothers and other villagers also attend.
- The Sarpanch of Gram Panchayat is also invited.
- The school teacher reports all details of the learning outcomes achieved by each pupil in the school and is discussed thoroughly.
- Parents fulfillment of Nava Sutralu during the month is also discussed.
- The salary of the teacher is authorized by school Committee only in Badi Panduga

Role of CDR:

- The concept, design and frame work for implementation of a community governed school is a seminal contribution of CDR
- CDR along with the members of VOs and MMSs selects the Teachers.
- CDR trains them in joyful teaching methodology through 7 day Foundation Course.
- CDR prepares a monthly lesson plan and trains every teacher every month for 2 days in teaching it well.
- CDRtrains and ensures complete community ownership and governance by the

mothers' groups.

- Provide continuous curriculum support to all the teachers.
- CDR is responsible for monthly monitoring and ensuring quality learning outcomes and put them in public domain.

Curriculum Support:

- Teacher's Foundation Training:
 - 7 days foundation training is provided to all the teachers in joyful and activity based teaching methodology.

• Monthly Lesson Plan Training:

 2 day advance training is provided to the teachers every month in teaching the next month's lesson plan.

• Cluster Resource Person (CRP) Support

- One CRP for every 10 to 12 schools.
- CRP will visit every school once every week to assist the teacher in delivering high quality education to pupils.



Training of Teachers of ITDA Primary Schools and Monitoring of Learning Outcomes in East Godavari Dist, Andhra Pradesh, during academic year 2017-18.

The Tribal Welfare Department, Government of Andhra Pradesh decided to partner with CDR for improving the quality of teaching and learning in 860 primary schools of Integrated Tribal Development Agency (ITDA), Rampachodavaram in East Godavari District.

As per the Order of Govt of AP, Tribal Welfare Department and the Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) executed with ITDA, Rampachidavaram, CDR has undertaken training of 2580 teachers of 860 ITDA and other Govt. primary schools in 13 mandals under the ITDA. More than 27,000 tribal children attend these schools. CDR has designed a 7 day training course specially for this purpose The entire training is structured on activity based teaching methodology for joyful learning. CDR is training these teachers in batches of 60 for one week since February 2016. CDR has completed training 1440 teachers (22 batches) in 2016-17 reporting year. Remaining 2 batches total 98 teachers training programme is completed in this reporting year.

Training of Anganwadi Teachers in activity based Joyful Teaching Methodology.

At the request of the District Collectors, CDR is training the Anganwadi Teachers in Telangana districts. The training is for 7 days. CDR has trained 480 AW teachers in Nizamabad district, 200 AW teachers in Manchiryal district and 240 AW teachers in Hyderabad district. CDR has completed training 920 AW teachers as on 29th November 2017. MOUs were entered into with the district authority for this purpose. The norms as specified in the Go issued by the TW.Dept, for training the ITDA primary school Teachers are being followed including the Training Fee payable to CDR at the rate of Rs.300/teacher per day.

Hundred of little children attending the Anganwadi are directly benefitting from these trainings. The feedback received from the trainees and the officials is more than encouraging.

Strengthening the curriculum and teaching processes and improve the methodology in 5 Ashrama Schools Maredumilli and Y.Ramavaram mandals of East Godavari Dist.

The learning standards in the Ashram Schools need lot of improvement. There is large scope for strengthening the curriculum and methodology to enhance the quality of the learning outcomes. The tribal children in the Ashram schools can easily be provided a joyful and memorable learning experience in these schools. CDR has proposed to partner with the Tribal Welfare Department of Govt. of AP and ITDA, Rampachodavaram to improve the academics in some remote and neglected Ashram Schools in Maredumilli and Y.Ramavaram mandals in East Godavari District. CDR has identified five Asram Schools in remote pockets of these two mandals. They are in Boduluru, Bodlanka, Banda, Daragadda and Gurthedu villages. Of these, Boduluru, Banda and Daragadda are Girls Asram Schools. 79 percent of the students studying in these schools belong to Konda Reddy tribe which is recognized as a very vulnerable tribe by the government.

The Government has issued an Order for entrusting academic activities to CDR for ensuring quality learning outcomes in 5 remote Ashram Schools in Boduluru, Banda, Bodlanka, Daragadda and Gurthedu villages located in Maredumilli and Y.Ramavaram mandals

CDR in collaboration with ITDA shall work for strengthening the curriculum and teaching processes and improve the methodology. It shall make joyful activity based teaching methodology the pivot of the learning process. All curriculum and extra curriculum activities shall be pupil centric. CDR shall endeavour to provide the best of the opportunities to every student and strive to bring out the best in him or her. Imparting first class knowledge and guiding the student to joyful learning shall be the basic purpose.

Registration of Girijana Rythu Seva Sanghamu, Bodlanka. (GRSSB)

GRSSB was formed by the tribal farmers and registered under the A.P. Societies Registration Act in April 2018. It provides a forum for the tribal farmers to access resources from different government programmes and from other institutions. It provides institutional support for realising the aspirations of the farmers. The Governing body of the GRSSB hopes to mobilise membership on a large scale in all the villages where it is and shall be working. It is soon getting a Custom Hiring Centre from the Govt of AP with two tractors, farm equipment and tools. It shall be hiring these to the member farmers.

CDR is establishing this Centre for Excellence (CFE) at Bodlanka with support and encouragement of the farmers. It is coming up in a 26 acre campus amidst verdurous surroundings. The CFE shall be a hub for transfer of knowledge to the tribal families in a very remote area. It hopes to provide knowledge and practises related to:

- a. Best farming practices to improve agricultural productivity.
- b. Access technology and machinery for improving yields and incomes of the tribal families.
- c. Provide first hand experience in adopting nature based farming or zero budget farming. Have a permanent training cum production centre for preparing the required inputs.
- d. Improve health conditions particularly of mother and child with emphasis on preventive health education. Provide best practises. Also have Medical Centre
- e. Conduct research and adopt content for improving the learning of the children in pre primary and primary schools. Have a proper well equipped training centre for this purpose.
- f. Identify and propagate technology for providing sustainable livelihoods like processing of natural resources, bamboo craft etc. Have training cum production Centres.
- g. Bring in the best methods for propagating rain fed plantations to provide sustainable incomes. Provide the best grafting techniques for plant production.

CDR shall be providing quality training and follow up in all the above activities. The GRSSB shall be following up and monitoring the results through its own group of Liaison Workers.

Bodlanka, Dharagadda Asram School and villages are now soaked under solar lights. Lights were set up with the aim of helping children to improve their educational standards even at night. CDR has funded it entirely.

Solar light Assembling Unit at Bodlanka:

CDR has set up this unit. It trained 9 tribal youth for 2 weeks in assembling solar lights. This unit is producing 4 different solar lights. They need to be sold in the market and through ITDA for the students in Ashram Schools.







Bee Keeping Training Programme

Total 7 persons were trained under bee keeping training programme organized by Krishi Vigyan Kendra, Pandirimamidi during 18.12.2017 to 23.12.2017. They also submitted applications showing interest for establishment of units at their respective villages Tenelamamidi & Bodlanka of Maredumill mandal. The amount of each beneficiary contribution Rs. 6,000/-, Total 42,000/- CDR paid the beneficiary contribution as requested by Dr. Srinivas of KVK, Pandirimamidi.

People Plantation Programme (PPP) for Sustainable Livelihoods 2017-18

Andhra Pradesh has a tribal population of 27.39 lakh and East Godavari district has a tribal population of 2.97 lakh, constituting around 5.62% of the district population. In East Godavari district, Koya Dora, Konda Reddy, Konda Kammari, Konda Kapu, Valmiki, etc are the major sub tribes out of which, Konda Reddy falls under Particularly Vulnerable Tribal Group (PVTG).

NTFP resources are getting depleted day by day due to over exploitation and almost no efforts on regeneration or conservation on the other hand.

In this regard, there were series of discussions and interactions involving community members and a baseline survey in the proposed area revealed that a significant number of tribals have shown interest to take up plantation of horticulture and NTFP species in their own lands.

Keeping this in view as far as the livelihood issues being faced are concerned, it is proposed to promote plantation of both Horticulture and NTFP in the own lands of tribals in wherein, inter cropping would be encouraged including vegetables, millets, Medicinal & Aromatic plants so as to improve the food & nutrition security, income security, health security besides increasing the green cover contributing ecological balance and sustainable livelihoods as well over a period of 4 years.

Facilitating Agencies' (CDR & Kovel) competency

Kovel Foundation and CDR working in the proposed Mandal i.e. Maredumilli of East Godavari District and the Facilitating Agencies having required expertise and experience in natural resource management and implementation of tribal development programs especially through various agroforestry plantations besides management. Based on this experience and presence in the proposed Mandal, it is proposed to implement a program namely "People's Plantation Program (PPP) for Sustainable Livelihoods" for tribal economic development.

Program Objectives

- To promote sustainable livelihoods to the tribal community with mixed / Block plantation in their own lands to realise increased incomes
- To promote and support Zero Budget Natural Farming interventions in plantation programs for making rain-fed based plantation programs as a best practice
- To promote and support Community Based Organizations for managing the program interventions beyond the program towards sustainability
