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Annual Report 2018-19

Centre for Development and Research (CDR) is working for the well being of the tribal People in East Godavari district since 2008. Overall objective that is to "Improve the quality of life of the poorest and most disadvantaged members of tribal society on a sustainable basis through community empowerment" in quite interior and far flung villages in Maredumilli and Y.Ramavaram Mandals. Konda Reddis, a vulnerable tribe, is the predominant section of the tribal population in this Mandals. CDR made a choice to work with the most needy of the tribals in the most remote of the district.

Geographical Conditions of the operational area:


East Godavari district can be broadly classified into three natural divisions, namely, the delta, upland and agency or hill tracts. The general elevation of the district varies from a few meters near the sea to about 300 meters in the hills of the agency. The Eastern Ghats rise by gradations from the level of the coast and spread throughout the agency 11 mandals.

Maredumilli Mandal:

It is composed of 78 villages. It is an interior Tribal habitation with 903.44 Sq. Kms. areas bordering with Khammam District endowed with evergreen Tropical Forest and Wildlife. There are many Tribal groups living and most of them were Primitive Tribes (PTGs). Podu Cultivation, Hunting, Animal Grazing and Forest Produce Collection are the way of living. In some places very good timber, tea, rubber and coffee plantations are existing. Infrastructure like roads, buildings, electricity, health, civic amenities and education is very less in comparison.

Y.Ramavaram Mandal:

Total population of Y. Ramavaram Mandal is 27,950 living in 6,549 Houses, Males are 13,587 and Females are 14,363. Y. Ramavaram consist of 148 Villages and 17 Panchayats. Kunkumamidi is the smallest Village and Donkarai is the biggest Village. It is in the 27 m elevation (altitude). Y. Ramavaram Mandal is bounded by by Maredumilli Mandal towards west, Addateegala Mandal towards South, Rampachodavaram Mandal towards South, Koyyuru Mandal towards East.



Maa Vooru Maa Badi Programme

CDR is the architect in designing these community governed schools. It is assisting the community of tribal mothers to run 54 pre-primary schools in as many villages for 3 to 5 year tiny tots. All these activity based schools are located in Maredumilli, Y.Ramavaram and Rampachodavaram Mandals in East Godavari District.

Objectives:

- Provide best quality activity based joyful education to children between 3 to 5 years.
- Build self confidence, enthusiasm and cheer among the little children and prepare them to go the Primary school
- Schools only in tribal areas and Scheduled Caste habitations
- Every school to be entirely owned and governed by the mothers
- Establish proof of concept for delivering high quality education in community governed pre primary schools for applying the same concept to Govt. Primary schools.

Unique Features of "Maa Vooru Maa Badi"

1. Pancha Teermanalu.

Every school is established by the community of mothers. They have to fulfill five essential pre requisites and pass the *Pancha Teermanalu*. They are

- i. Resolve to set up a school
- ii. Survey the children in prescribed age group identified for enrollment.
- iii. Identify persons suitable for teaching their children
- iv. Identify suitable place for the school.
- v. Nominate a five members School Committee of mothers.

2. Nava Sutralu - Nine Responsibilities

- Ensure full attendance in the school
- ii. Two mothers to participate in school activities everyday by rotation at least for one hour
- iii. Attend weekly display of articles made by children during daily session of creative activities
- iv. Invite grand parents every week for sharing their stories

- v. Conduct Badi Panduga on last Saturday of every month
- vi. Save Rs. 100 every month for every child in school
- vii. Teams of MMS members to visit every school once every month
- viii. Celebrate Birthday of the child by planting and protecting two saplings in their field
 - ix. Save Rs. 10 for each pupil every month for meeting the needs of the school

3. Monthly visit of schools by members of Mandala Mahila Samakhya.

 Village Organisation (VO) and the Badi Committee examine the learning outcomes achieved by the children every month.

4.Badi Panduga: Monthly Public Report on Learning Outcomes

- Badi Panduga Festival of Learning is held in the last Saturday of every month in every school.
- All mothers and other villagers also attend.
- The Sarpanch of Gram Panchayat is also invited.
- The school teacher reports all details of the learning outcomes achieved by each pupil in the school and is discussed thoroughly.
- Parents fulfillment of Nava Sutralu during the month is also discussed.
- The salary of the teacher is authorized by school Committee only in Badi Panduga

Role of CDR:

- The concept, design and frame work for implementation of a community governed school is a seminal contribution of CDR
- CDR along with the members of VOs and MMSs selects the Teachers.
- CDR trains them in joyful teaching methodology through 7 day Foundation Course.
- CDR prepares a monthly lesson plan and trains every teacher every month for 2 days in teaching it well.
- CDRtrains and ensures complete community ownership and governance by the

mothers' groups.

- Provide continuous curriculum support to all the teachers.
- CDR is responsible for monthly monitoring and ensuring quality learning outcomes and put them in public domain.

Curriculum Support:

• Teacher's Foundation Training:

 7 days foundation training is provided to all the teachers in joyful and activity based teaching methodology.

Monthly Lesson Plan Training:

 2 day advance training is provided to the teachers every month in teaching the next month's lesson plan.

• Cluster Resource Person (CRP) Support

- One CRP for every 10 to 12 schools.
- CRP will visit every school once every week to assist the teacher in delivering high quality education to pupils.







Strengthening the curriculum and teaching processes and improve the methodology in 5 Ashrama Schools Maredumilli and Y.Ramavaram mandals of East Godavari Dist.


The learning standards in the Ashram Schools need lot of improvement. There is large scope for strengthening the curriculum and methodology to enhance the quality of the learning outcomes. The tribal children in the Ashram schools can easily be provided a joyful and memorable learning experience in these schools. CDR has proposed to partner with the Tribal Welfare Department of Govt. of AP and ITDA, Rampachodavaram to improve the academics in some remote and neglected Ashram Schools in Maredumilli and Y.Ramavaram mandals in East Godavari District. CDR has identified five Asram Schools in remote pockets of these two mandals. They are in Boduluru, Bodlanka, Banda, Daragadda and Gurthedu villages. Of these, Boduluru, Banda and Daragadda are Girls Asram Schools. 79 percent of the students studying in these schools belong to Konda Reddy tribe which is recognized as a very vulnerable tribe by the government.


The Government has issued an Order for entrusting academic activities to CDR for ensuring quality learning outcomes in 5 remote Ashram Schools in Boduluru, Banda, Bodlanka, Daragadda and Gurthedu villages located in Maredumilli and Y.Ramavaram mandals


CDR in collaboration with ITDA shall work for strengthening the curriculum and teaching processes and improve the methodology. It shall make joyful activity based teaching methodology the pivot of the learning process. All curriculum and extra curriculum activities shall be pupil centric. CDR shall endeavour to provide the best of the opportunities to every student and strive to bring out the best in him or her. Imparting first class knowledge and guiding the student to joyful learning shall be the basic purpose.











CDR has started working in promoting measures to prevent ill health with the women SHGs

MISSION: Freedom from ill health

<u>Target area</u>: Chavidikota, Pullangi and Chattawada Panchayaths in Maredumilli Mandal- All villages in each Panchayath-beginning with Chavidikota panchayath.

Concept: Prevent all causes of ill health, from infant to the old.

Idenfity reasons for ill health properly.

<u>Freedom from ill health</u>' Graama Samoorna Aarogya Pranalika' can be achieved only if the community particularly all women and mothers become genuine and active partners in this effect.

Mode of Interventions:

A. Through household survey of :

- Food consumption patterns round the year
- · Nutrient content of the food consumed
- Daily practices of personal hygiene, home cleanliness, toilet practices etc.,
- Child care protection
- Caring for drinking water
- Daily, weekly and monthly budgets for food items. Whether anything grown at home or field.
- · Content of Vit A and C and protein in daily food

Analysis of the survey data and identifying key areas for intervention.

B. What can be done to improve health?

- Individual household plan
- Collective community plan
- · To workout different components carefully

C. Focus on food and nutrition

• Promote better nutrition

- Keep grow and consume leafy vegetables every day
- Sprouts can be introduced
- New recipes can be thought of . Cooking classes and training can be given

D. Backyard safety net

- One drumstick plant
- One Papaya plant
- One bachchala tea
- 10x5 Green leaf bed at all times

G. Monitoring outcomes

- a) The peoples forum should monitor all matters related to health once every fortnight.
- b) Village Health/individual illness/preventive measures should be on the agenda of every SHG, VO and Grama Pnachayath.
- c) A protocol for taking preventive measures should be followed with special focus on:
 - i. Mother and Child-lactating and pregnant women
 - ii. Adolescent girls
 - iii. Infants
 - iv. Nutrition -Food Action for consuming minimum levels of intake
 - v. Aged persons- Geriatric Care -Special care measures

Tribal women farmers on 27th Jan at Bodlanka:

Around 300 women farmers from the Kanivada, Chattalawada, Pullangi, Chavadikota and Chintalapudi panchayats are participated in this Girijana Mahila Rythu sadassu.

The following topics were discussed at this Mahila Sadassu:

- About Girijana Rythu Seva Sanghamu, Bodlanka.
- About Uttama Pramanala Sadhana Kendramu., Bodlanka.

Enrollment of Members:

100 farmer groups- Contact farmers- selection of Rythu Karyakartha- forming Rythu SHGs- opening bank account.

Benefits of Membership:

- 1. Rythu Seva Kendramu- Hiring of tractors, machines and equipment.
- 2. Education of the Girl Child on priority.
- 3. Maa Vooru Maa badi in all villages of the members.

Seed supply for one acre in one crop:

- 1. Natural farming training and production Centres
- 2. Food processing units in very panchayath for Jack fruit, Annoto oil, Milllet snacks etc.
- 3. Hydraulic Pumps where ever possible.
- 4. Vegetable gardens in every village.
- 5. Village Shop
- 6. Trainings in skills like garment making, pickle making, honey making etc.

- 7. Preventive health programme.
- 8. Establishing Crèches for babies and toddlers and care for aged.

What the Farmers should do.

A. Membership.

- 1. Enrol as members by paying membership fee.
- 2. Retain membership fee with the Farmer SHGs
- 3. Form 100 farmers groups.
- 4. Form 10 farmer groups.
- 5. Select Rythu Karyakarthas.
- 6. Prepare a People's village Devp plan
- 7. Form into a Community Action Group.
- B. **Education**: Identify eligible girls for education support- prepare plan of support and amount required.
- C. Bala Badi: Identify place prepare list of children, identify suitable persons for teaching to attend selection test.
- D. **Seed**: Finalise farmer wise seed requirement for the village.
- E. Identify suitable sites for **hydraulic pumps**. Prepare the farmers for sharing the cost on per acre basis.
- F. **Tractor Hiring**: Identify farmers for tractor tilling and collect the hire charges.
- G. Attend all **trainings**. Learn and adopt nature farming methods.
- H. People's Health:
 - form into action groups for taking timely action for preventive health.
 - Follow up on health of pregnant and lactating women and children. Ensure monthly check up at PHC.
 - Nutritious food consumption. Discuss and decide the best menu for every house hold. Increase green leaf and proteinous food consumption.
 - Prepare place and budget for Crèches and care for the aged.
 - Trainings in safe delivery, hygienic menstruation management, nutritious food making.

Farmer Training Camp at A.M.Kota on 25th April 2018.

Around 120 farmers from Kanivada, Chattalawada, Pullangi, Chavadikota and Chintalapudi panchayats are participating in this tribal farmers' training camp. In this camp mainly focused on Peoples Plantation Programme (PPP) and Nursery's in Maredumilli Mandal under MGNREGS.

Preliminary work.

- 1. All Villages in Chavadikota, Pullangi and Chatlawada Panchayats are selected.
- 2. Farmers are identified. Documentation is in progress.
- 3. Plant requirement as per the preference of the farmers is worked out, both for multiple species and podu plantations. Proposed extent is 1000 acres each.
- 4. Not more than one acre per farmer.
- 5. Project Proposal for the 2018 PPP shall be submitted for approval by KF before 30th April. It shall also contain he 2nd year maintenance costs for the farmers of 2017 plantation.

Nurseries.

Dr. Srinivasa Rao of Kovel Foundation is responsible

- 1. Seed collection shall be completed by Srinivasa Rao of KF before 05th May. Purchase and delivery of bags also shall be completed by 10th May.
- 3. Red earth collection shall be completed at the nursery sites by 15th May.
- 4. Bag filling to be completed by 20th May.
- 5. Dibble of seed in the bags to be completed by 30th May.

Nursery locations and villages attached.

Details of nursery wise farmers, species and number of saplings to be raised, shall be finalised by Srinivasa Rao of Kovel Foundation before 30th April.

1. Chatlawada Panchayath.

A. Chatlawada Nursery: CHATLAWADA. BODULURU, NELLRU (3 villages)

B. Potlawada Nursery: POTLAWDA KOTHAVEEDHI NOOKALETIWADA OKKULURU. VEZUWADA (5 villages)

2. Pullangi Panchayath.

A. Adhravalasa Nursery: PULLANGI ADHARAVALASA EGAVALASA. PEEDAMARRI. PUSIWADA (5 visages)

B. Busigandi Nursery: BUSIGANDI. PAMULAMAMIDI GUMPENAGANDI, GUDISE. (4 villages)

3. Chavadikota Panchayath.

A. Banda Nuersery: BANDA. CHEKKAWADA THURRAWADA. SIRIPENALVA (4 villages)

B. Bodlanka Nursery: BODLANKA TENELAMAMIDI. KOTHAVEEDHI. NIMMACHETLABANDA UPPARAGOTULA. BODDUMANUVEEDHI. CHAVADIKOTA. MUNTHMMADI (8 villages)

Total 29 villages.

Women groups sall be selected for raising nurseries. They shall be Trained on site by the PHO in nursery practices and dos and donts in raising healthy plants.

Farmer Training Camp at A.M.Kota on 25th April 2018.















Sri B.Rajashekar, I.A.S, Secretary to Govt. visited CFE- Bodlanka on 29th May 2018

It was an important occasion on many counts. It is not often that a Secretary to Govt. visits a very interior village like Bodlanka and has the privilege of spending time with the tribal farmers, almost all of them Konda Reddys. Mr. Rajshekar did, on 29th May, 2018

He laid the Foundation Stone for the ZBNF Jeevamruthamula production and Training centre in the campus of CDR's Centre for Excellence (CFE) at Bodlanka.

Along with 19 others, he planted saplings along the road in the CFE. He visited the CDR Centre for making Solar Lights. Mr. Rajshekar addressed a large group of tribal women and men farmers who came from 6 interior panchayaths to listen to him. The following, inter alia, were assured by Mr. Rajshekar for the farmers from these six panchayaths.

1. Check dams and solar pump sets on perennial streams:

A thorough survey shall be conducted along every perennial stream to identify locations for construction of check dams for much needed irrigation. DD Agr, and ADA, soil conservation were requested to complete it in 40 days.

B. At least 10 solar pump sets shall be supplied in the three panchayaths including in Uthama Pramanala Sadhana Kendramu, Bodlanka through the Girijana Rythu Seva Sanghamu.

2. Oil Engines:

Six oil engines shall be supplied, one at each of the People's Nurseries being grown under the Peoples Plantation Programme. Shade Nets and other tools and implements shall also be provided as required for these decentralised nurseries planned by CDR and are being grown by the tribal SHG women in quite remote villages to provide healthy plant material for People's Plantation Programme (PPP).

3. Agri ServicingCentre:

An Agri Servicing Centre shall be set set up as per norms for the Girijana Rythu Seva Sanghamu, Bodlanka, with all required components.DD, Ag,r shall ensure.7

4. ZBNF Centres:

A ZBNF training cum production centre to priodce the Americans shall be set up as planned by CDR at the CFE, Bodlanka and at all the six nursery villages immediately. These shall be set up on a permanent basis. A well thought out training calender shall be implemented with immediate effect.

DD, Agr, and DPM, ZBNF, Agency Area, shall be personally responsible.

5. Crop seed inputs:

A systematic Farmers Plan for crop inputs shall be prepared in every village in the identified six contiguous interior tribal panchayaths of Chavadikota, Pullangi, Chatlawada, Kanivada, Daragedda and Chintalapudi in Maredumilli and Y.Ramavaram mandals. Seed inputs for millets, pulses, paddy and other crops being grown shall be supplied as per norms before 10th June.

6. Purchase of Solar Lamps made by tribal youth at the CDR Centre for Making Solar Lights, Bodlanka.

CDR has trained tribal youth and set up a solar light making unit in Bodlanka. Four different models of solar lights are made at this Centre. A set of these lights was given to Mr. Rajshekar for further examining the feasibility for purchase of these lights for use in the tribal areas in lieu of abolishing sale of harmful kerosene.

7. Units for processing Jack fruit, mango, tamarind and cashew fruit.

This area is very rich in natural produce. Feasibility for establishing suitable scale processing units should be examined with a cist benefit analysis. At least one if not more units should be established in each panchayath. DD, Agr, shall work in close collaboration with Veugu officials shall be responsible.

8. Soil conservation work:

Very little SC work is done so far in this area. The DD, Agr, shall supervise and will be responsible for the following.

- A. Identification of at least 200 acres in each village fir SC work as per norms.
- B. All PPP lands should be covered including the podu lands identified for PPP.
- C. At least 100 acres of Agriculture Crop Lands should be covered in every year in each village in the 6 panchayaths till completion of all such lands.

A special proposal after due scrutiny should be submitted for approval.









Custom Hiring Centre established in bodlanka with Two Tractors, two Cultivators and one Rotavator. The Agriculture department sanctioned 60% cost of the centre to Girijana Rythu Seva Sangham Bodlanka. The balance 40% of farmer contribution paid CDR.







Developing Irrigation by Installation of Hydraulic rams on perennial streams in interior villages. It runs without electricity or any fuel.

A MOU with Vijayavahini Charitable foundation (VCF-An initiative of Tata Trust) was signed in November 2018 to set up 4 hydraulic rams in Bodlanka and three other villages. A Single ram with two inch flow costs Rs 85,000/- VCF shall bear 50% of the cost. Water shall start flowing out of these Rams by end of December 2018 irrigating 15 acres on an average under each. More installations shall follow.
